House Blessing kits for Feast of Epiphany

This weekend, each Holy Trinity household is invited to take home a kit containing the Epiphany blessing, a piece of chalk, and a small bottle of holy water for you and your family to bless your home.

It has been a tradition in a number of European cultures to pray a blessing over the home on the Feast of the Epiphany. Known as 'chalking the door' this Epiphany blessing is one way that families and individuals can invite God's blessing into their home and family life throughout the year.

The blessing is very simple. It involves a short reading from scripture, the tracing of "20 +C +M +B +24" (without the quotation marks) by a family member over the lintel of the main entrance to the home (inside or outside are equally fine options), and a short, shared prayer to end.

The numbers are for the current year.

The letters C, M, B have two meanings:

- They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.
- They also abbreviate the Latin words Christus
 Mansionem Benedicat, which stands for "May Christ
 bless the house."

The "+" signs represent the cross, a reminder that it is through Christ's Passion, death and resurrection that all grace flows and that it will be our family's willingness to share each other's crosses throughout the year that will be the greatest source of blessing for all who abide in and enter our homes.
