

Holy Trinity update from Fr Lorne

Saturday 5 pm Mass—we have two Confirmation Masses Saturdays at 5 pm (Sept. 12 & 26 for registered families only). We plan to resume Saturday 5 pm Masses starting October 3. We need at least 3 helpers at each Mass.

Some members of Holy Trinity Liturgy team met this week to talk about expanding weekend Masses. We agreed to proceed with Saturday 5 pm Mass starting Oct. 3. More details next week about pre-registering for that Mass.

Our team will be actively recruiting people to assist at Masses. The first step is to contact everyone who participated in a liturgical ministry in the past year. This will include altar servers, children's liturgists, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, musicians and singers, ushers and greeters. Some of these ministries, such as altar servers and Eucharistic ministers will not be resuming in the near future. We are hopeful that many of you will be able to assist in a different area.

If we have enough helpers for Saturday Masses in October, and enough interest in people assisting at Sunday Masses, we will look at expanding to two Sunday Masses, perhaps in November.

Duties of Mass helpers:

1 person at north door to welcome parishioners, check their name off the pre-registration list and ask if self-assessment has been done.

1 or 2 people in the Gathering Area to remind parishioners to sanitize hands and ensure social distancing until they can be seated.

1 or more people in the church to seat parishioners. Contact the office if you are willing to assist.

Mass details on page 5 including information on receiving a blessing instead of the Eucharist at Mass. We are following the protocols in place by SK Government and Archdiocese. These documents are available on the Archdiocese website if you have questions about protocols.

Self-assessment Questions You will be asked the following when you book a weekend Mass, as well as when you arrive at Holy Trinity for any Mass:

Do you have COVID-19 or live with someone with COVID-19?

Have you been exposed to someone with COVID-19?

Are you sick, including even one of the slightest symptoms or feelings of sickness, especially upper respiratory or flu-like symptoms such as fever, cough, headache, aches & pains, sore throat, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell or shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?

Have you travelled outside of Regina in the past two weeks?

The upholstery at Holy Trinity is not able to be sanitized. Pews on the south side of the church do not have upholstery and you may request to sit there, providing they are available with proper distancing.

Sacramental Preparation

Baptism Preparation (for parents of infants and young children). Next session is Thursday, October 6 at 7:00 pm. Class fee is \$20

For children age 7 and older who have not yet been baptized, we have classes for the children and parent(s) beginning in September.

Parents of children in Grade 2 and up for the 2020/2021 school year you can now register your child for the sacraments of Confirmation, First Holy Communion, and First Reconciliation. Classes begin Sunday, September 27.

Parent orientation meeting is Thursday, September 17, 2020, at 7:00 pm in the Church. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, all registrations must be received before this date. You cannot enter the church for the meeting unless you have pre-registered. Registration is \$50/child or \$75/family payable before or on that evening. We accept cash, cheque or e-mail transfer. Class schedules are on our website under the Sacraments tab.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA is a process for adults seeking initiation into the Catholic Church. Weekly gatherings consist of prayer and sharing as we come to discover where God is calling each person. The process is open to:

- all those not baptized
- those baptized in another denomination now seeking to make a profession of faith in the Catholic Church and be confirmed and receive Holy Eucharist
- those baptized Catholics who have not completed their Christian Initiation (have not been Confirmed and/or have not received First Eucharist)

The RCIA journey involves the faith community as a whole by deepening its own conversion to Christ and by providing a prayerful example of Christian living for those inquiring into the Catholic faith.

Holy Trinity open for Masses for approximately 50

Government of Saskatchewan guidelines for Places of Worship are permitting more people in churches that can accommodate them by following the needed protocols for distancing and cleaning.

At Holy Trinity, we have seating for approximately 50 people, dependent on whether they come as couples, singles or families. We are registering as many as possible for weekend Masses and monitoring how many helpers we need to provide the controls required for distancing and cleaning.

Masks are recommended but not required at this time.

Requests for Sunday 10 am Mass Attendance are being co-ordinated in the office. Two Sunday Masses will resume as soon as we have enough helpers to assist with this — we hope in November. Call the parish office (306) 543-3838 or email htrinity@sasktel.net. Requests will be handled during our regular office hours, which have been Monday to Friday, 9 am to 2 pm. Please provide a day-time phone number so we can call you back and confirm an attendance date. Questions about your health will be asked at time of booking (see separate box). Those registered are being given detailed instructions.

Weekday Mass Attendance - Generally weekday Masses are Monday to Friday at 8:30 am. You do not need to register in advance. Come to the north door; we will record your name and phone number and ask the health assessment questions.

Sat 5 pm Mass will resume October 3, as long as we can fill the positions needed Saturday afternoons. More details in the bulletin.

Church Open for Prayer—We will continue to have the church open for prayer from 9 am to 2 pm, Monday to Friday, unless otherwise published in the bulletin.

Church Pews—at Holy Trinity are marked to for the 2 metre guidelines of social distancing. Our upholstered pews cannot be sanitized. If you wish to bring your own seat cushion or towel, please do so. The wooden pews on the south side of the church do not have upholstery. If you prefer to sit there, check with the person directing this. Seating for Mass will be done from front to back. For exiting after Mass, it will be reversed, from back to front. These directions will be announced at the Mass.

Photos on website—check these out on the home page to give you an idea of our setup.

Promptness—to ensure we can monitor who is attending, the doors will be locked at the start of Mass. This also allows us to provide the proper number of hosts needed for that Mass.

Other Liturgy Changes—

Instructions about the Mass and going forward for Eucharist or a Blessing will be done either by announcement or individual instructions before Mass.

Singing is a high-risk activity so we will not have this except for special music as we can fit this in safely.

Proclaimers of the Word—First Reading, Psalm, Second Reading and intercessory prayers are all proclaimed by the same person, from a microphone at a second ambo (lectern) at the front. Microphones are changed between users and sit for 72 hours before being used by another person. The ambo and mike by the altar are to be used only by the priest.

Collection—a donation box is inside the glass doors for your envelope instead of being collected from you in the pew.

Eucharist—hosts will be consecrated on a table and parishioners will come forward, one household group at a time. Stand behind the black tape line; Father will say “The Body of Christ”; respond ‘Amen’, then step forward and pick up the host closest to you; take a step or two away before consuming.

A Blessing is available for those unable to receive the Eucharist. Come forward as if you were receiving communion, but cross your arms over your chest to indicate you wish a blessing. The priest will give you a verbal blessing.

Non-credit course at Campion: A Closer Look at the Gospel of Luke

Tuesdays from 1 to 2 pm, September 22 to November 24

Let's explore the Gospel of Luke together! We'll do a deeper dive into both the literary and historical aspects. It will be done through short lectures virtually through URCourses. You should have a University of Regina email address to log in so this is ideal for both current and former UofR and Campion students. There is no charge for the course, but there is an optional resource book for \$10.
