Holy Trinity update:**Masks required for indoor public spaces**

([Current Public Health Orders](#) Sept. 30 Public Health Order "Mandatory Isolation & Face Covering" available as PDF)
Exemptions found in Section 4c of the Sept. 30 Public Health Order. This includes individuals under the age of two years and those with a medical condition with written confirmation from a health professional, details outlined in Section 4f. If an official with Saskatchewan Health Authority comes to check on our compliance with health directives, failure to show proof may result in fines for individuals, Churches and/or Priests.

Hand sanitizer available at the entrances and before receiving communion.

Collection—will continue with box at the glass doors.

Sign of Peace may still be expressed with a bow or similar gesture. Physical touching (shaking hands, hugging, etc.) is discouraged.

The Archdiocese of Regina is encouraging parishes to be cautious and prudent.

Proof of vaccination—places of worship exempt.

Stay home if you are not feeling well.

Did you know... Did you know that... the Truth and Reconciliation Commission [TRC] put forward 94 Calls to Action. Number 59 states: 'We call upon church parties to the Settlement Agreement to develop on-going education strategies to ensure that their respective congregations learn about their church's role in colonization, the history and legacy of residential schools and why apologies to former residential schools students, their families and communities were necessary.'

2022 Spiritual Adoption Program

Following the Masses on Jan. 22/23 and Jan. 29/30, parishioners will have the opportunity to once again begin praying to birth a baby in danger of being aborted.

GREEN RIBBON CAMPAIGN, JAN 22 & 23: Regina Pro-Life is sponsoring the Green Ribbon Campaign to remember our preborn brothers and sisters who have been denied life. On January, 28, 1988, the Supreme Court of Canada issued the Morgentaler decision, which struck down abortion as part of the criminal code. Since then, there have been no laws to regulate abortion in Canada through all 9 months of pregnancy. Wear a green ribbon on January 28 to remember the millions of Canadians who have lost their lives to abortion. Specifically pray for the preborn and for women in crisis pregnancies, seeking abortion. Each year, approximately 2,000 abortions are performed in Sask. hospitals.


