Green Ribbon Campaign. Regina Pro-Life is sponsoring the Green Ribbon Campaign to remember our preborn brothers and sisters, who were denied life. On January 28, 1988, the Supreme Court of Canada issued the Morgentaler decision, which struck down abortion as part of the criminal code. Since then, there have been no laws to regulate abortion in Canada through all 9 months of pregnancy and there have been more than 4 million abortions in Canada. Pick up a green ribbon/bookmark in the Welcoming Area. You are encouraged to wear the ribbon until January 28, but you can certainly wear it longer. The bookmark includes a prayer for the end to abortion that you are asked to pray daily.


