

Fr. Roch Mary Greiner, CFR

is a member of the Community of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. He left his home and career in Orange County, CA in 2007, responding to the invitation of the Lord to live a consecrated life. Before he was a friar, he ran his own business as a welder and sheet metal fabricator. As a layman he served the Church in juvenile hall jail ministry and has a background with the Charismatic Renewal.

Fr. Roch is currently assigned to St. Juan Diego Friary in Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he serves as local superior and Chaplain to Project Defending Life. As a friar he has served in New York and New Jersey, as a missionary in Central America and prison chaplain in Honduras and Nicaragua.

In Albuquerque, Fr. Roch enjoys serving with his fellow friars in their outreach to the homeless. His other passions include preaching at retreats, Parish Missions, and directing a Healing Ministry. He has a deep love and reverence for the Word of God. Fr. Roch considers Sacred Scripture and his relationship with Our Lord as the foundation for his preaching and ministry.

He is also an avid outdoorsman who enjoys hiking, camping and fishing.



Fr. Juan Diego Sutherland, CFR

serves in Albuquerque as the director of Fr. Roberts Kitchen, the friar's outreach to the homeless. Aside from his work with the homeless, Fr. Juan Diego assists parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, and travels frequently to preach retreats, parish missions, and days of recollection.

Fr. Juan Diego has spent over 10 years of his religious life as a missionary in Central America, in Honduras and Nicaragua. He has served as local superior, director of San Benito Jose medical clinic in Comayagua, Honduras, as well as director of St. Benedict's outreach in Fort Worth, TX, and prison Chaplain in Matagalpa, Nicaragua.

Fr. Juan Diego grew up in Canada. Upon completion of his studies at St. Joseph's Seminary, Dunwoodie, NY, in 2007, he was ordained to the priesthood at St. Patrick's Cathedral, NY.

In March of 2022 the Holy Father appointed Fr. Juan Diego a Missionary of Mercy, granting him faculties to hear confessions at any time and place and to absolve sins in cases otherwise reserved to the Holy See.

Fr. Juan Diego is a friar at heart. His spirituality is deeply Franciscan, joyful, incarnational, scriptural, and Eucharistic. He also enjoys woodworking, cooking, writing, reading history and literature.
